



GEORGE URBAN MANSION



The George Urban Mansion, located at 280 Pine Ridge Road, stands as an historic landmark reflecting the industrial and architectural legacy of Buffalo and Western New York. Built in 1869, the mansion was the grand residence of George Urban Ir., a prominent businessman, inventor, and investor whose contributions to electric power generation, grain milling, horticulture, and animal husbandry helped shape the region's economic and technological advancements.

The Urban Family and Their Estate

The Urban family's roots in Buffalo trace back to the mid-1800s when George Urban Sr. owned a grocery store at Main and Genesee Streets. He later expanded his family's legacy by founding a flour milling business, the Urban Milling Company. His son, George Urban Ir., began working there in 1866 and became a partner in 1870. George Urban, Sr. retired in 1885 and George, Jr. took over as head of the firm. The Urban Milling Company became one of the first electric-powered flour mills in the country, a revolutionary step that positioned Buffalo as a major player in grain processing.





The land this historic home stands on was acquired by Pennock Winspear in 1841. It was a vast 120-acre farm know as Pine Hill. The Urban family owned adjacent property, and in the 1860s, when the George Urban, Jr. married Ada Winspear, the Urban-Winspear Estate was formed and stretched over 160 acres. The estate had

a greenhouse with lemon trees, extensive flower and vegetable gardens and a vineyard with 29 varieties of grapes.

Beyond its beauty, the mansion held a notable place in the community as a social and cultural center, hosting gatherings and events. George Urban Jr. was deeply involved in local affairs, and his mansion became a gathering place for Buffalo's elite

It was at a social event, held at the Mansion in the summer of 1883, that the first Presidential Campaign of Grover Cleveland was launched. Over forty prominent politicians and businessmen had gathered at Urban's home, when Gerhard Lang, of Buffalo brewery fame, raised a toast to "Grover Cleveland, our next President". Cleveland laughed at the time, but in 1884, was elected the 22nd President of the United States. This event is now memorialized in a historic plaque located in front of the house.

The area was renamed Pine Ridge Road in 1893. It remained largely in the Urban Family's hands until the 1920s when the Felician Order of Sisters purchased part of the estate to use as their convent and school. The Sisters later founded Villa Maria College on this property in 1961. The Villa Maria College campus is located a few blocks down Pine Ridge Road from the mansion. In the 1930s and 1940s, portions were sold off to create new subdivisions, the Cheektowaga Town Park, and other developments.


THE HISTORY

The Mansion's Architecture and Features

Designed in the Italian Renaissance Revival style, the George Urban Mansion embodies the opulence of the late 19th century. It boasted grand columns, a sprawling porch, intricate woodwork, ornately decorated ceilings, and stained-glass windows. Inside, the home features:

- A large wooden staircase, carved from trees on the estate
- · Original chandeliers, hung when electricity was added, and pocket doors
- Eight fireplaces and impeccably maintained hardwood floors
- An elevator, which once connected the floors
- A crescent-shaped driveway, the site of many cherished family memories

The mansion was home to multiple generations of the Urban family. Charles Urban Banta, grandson of George Urban Jr., lived there from 1926 to 1945. In a nostalgic visit decades later, he recalled the bustling household of nine family



George Urban Milling Co. survived the Depression; expansions allowed the mill to offer Urban's Pie Flour and Up-and-Up, a self-rising cake flour. The company shipped to eastern markets that included all of New England, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania

members, the joy of playing on the estate, and the excitement of seeing new innovations that his grandfather introduced, noting that he had a great friendship with Thomas Edison and had the house wired before electricity had been invented. During the early 20th century, the estate was a lively place, with ponies, rowboats on a pond, and farm animals delighting the younger generations. The Urbans became famous for breeding racehorses on the property. Their primary love was trotters but they also bred saddle horses and show horses. However, as time passed and family members pursued careers and education elsewhere, the farm transitioned into a seasonal retreat.

By the 1950s, the home sat mostly vacant and was sold outside of the Urban Family to Pauline and George Fracasso. The Fracassos were responsible for many renovations to the home, including transforming the wraparound porch into an indoor ballroom. They were prominent in the community and hosted many upscale events in the house. They also faced the loss, due to fire, of a two-story H-shaped barn on the property. The fire, which raged out of control for about an hour and a half, sent flames 100 feet into the air. Luckily, George was able to rescue the two horses who were housed in the barn and no one was hurt.

After the Fracassos sold the home, it changed hands a few more times before being purchased by the current owners, Olivia and Derrick Warburton, in 2004. The mansion has been modernized over the years including the additions of a large indoor swimming pool, sauna, and tennis courts in the 1980s.

Today, the George Urban Mansion covers over 7,200 square feet and includes 7 bedrooms, 5 bathrooms, a 6-car garage, and modern amenities. Despite the upgrades, it retains the craftsmanship of its original design, reflecting Buffalo's industrial history and the Urban family's influence.

Visitors and historians alike marvel at the home's woodwork, historical artifacts, and connection to a bygone era. As one admirer put it, "The craftsmanship, this kind of technique—they just don't do anymore."

In design and renovation projects it's often about working with what is already in the space. Reasons to keep existing items may be about budget, liking that item, or knowing it has life beyond its current condition. The question becomes, can these outdated things be made to look current? The simple answer is yes.

My first impression when I walked through the kitchen was that it looked like it was from a Barbie doll house. The cabinets were small. The countertops and appliances were pink. Things perfect for when Barbie was first introduced in 1959 But this is 2025

I believe things can be salvaged, repurposed, given a new lease on life. So I kept the cabinets and the pink countertops and the pink appliances.

I have embraced the pink and brought in more of it. I've added other soft colors as companion colors in the palette. Then I added black and white for sharp contrast to the soft palette. Chrome likely would have been the original metal color used in the kitchen, I've added that back in a modern way.

The most effective way to transform a space is to place original artwork in it. Erin Loganathan has created paintings that help make this little kitchen a modern space no longer just for Barbie.


The Bathroom

This was a sad bathroom when I first walked into the space. A sink and vanity that were falling apart. An ill placed medicine cabinet. A toilet that was not properly installed. But there was a classic clawfoot tub With that, this room had potential.

The kitchen that once belonged to Barbie needed a companion bathroom that was befitting of its new design. It started with embracing the pink. Then layered in sharp contrast of black and white. Added deep maroon to the bathtub

creating an unexpected color combination with the pink.

Building on the use of color in this room is the use of texture. The marbled look of the custom vanity base creates movement within its strict form. The panels behind the bathtub give texture, strong lines, and deep color as the print tries to push beyond its edges.

Then there are the accessories. A bit of humor with the toilet paper rolls wrapped in graphic black and white paper. Large blocks of Himalayan pink salt give a soft texture. Additionally, there is the use of original artwork.

These elements collectively create a space that is dynamic, bold and unexpected.
